TV COVERAGE

This game is being televised nationally on ESPNU. Dave Armstrong (play-by-play), Mike Gottfried (analyst) and Graham Bensinger (sidelines) call the action.

CAVALIERS GO OUT OF CONFERENCE

Virginia steps out of conference for the first of three straight weeks Saturday against Pittsburgh.

The Cavaliers have won their last three games, all in conference, and are in first place in the Coastal Division of the ACC. Standing at 3-1 overall, UVa is off to its best start in two years.

After winning its first two games, Pittsburgh has lost its last two and stands at 2-2 this season.

This is the third meeting between the two schools in the last five seasons.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Cedric Peerman has rushed for 461 yards in the last three games an average of 153.7 ypg
- DE Chris Long is second in the country in sacks with an average of 1.5/g
- Jameel Sewell has completed 64 percent of his passes during the three-game winning streak
- Virginia has won nine of its last 10 non-conference home games
- Virginia is 31-9 at home under head coach Al Groh

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

Players are available each Tuesday following Coach Groh's press conference until 1:45 p.m. This is the best opportunity to interview players. If you have specific player interview requests, they should be directed to Andy Fledderjohann in the UVa Athletics Media Relations office by Noon Monday.

No player interviews will be arranged after Wednesday during game week.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia's locker room is closed to media following games, both at home and on the road.

Coach Groh will hold his post-game press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Groh. UVa athletics media relations personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

THE SERIES VS. THE PANTHERS

- Pittsburgh leads the all-time series by a 3-1 margin
- Pittsburgh has won all three regular-season match-ups in convincing fashion—26-0 in Charlottesville in 1953, 18-7 in Pittsburgh in 1955 and 38-13 last season
- Last year's match-up was the first regular-season meeting between the two schools in more than half a century
- UVa's only win was a 23-16 victory in the 2003 Continental Tire Bowl in Charlotte, N.C.
- Two current Cavaliers played in the bowl match-up four years ago—G Ian-Yates Cunningham (started) and G Gordie Sammis

VIRGINIA VS. THE BIG EAST

- Virginia is 19-18-1 all-time vs. the current membership of the Big East
- The Cavaliers had won six straight vs. the Big East until last season's loss to Pittsburgh
- Against schools who were Big East members at game time, Virginia is 11-10 overall
- Most of the games came against in-state rival Virginia Tech (6-7) when the Hokies were Big East members. UVa is 2-0 vs. Syracuse, 1-1 vs. Pittsburgh, 1-0 vs. Temple and West Virginia, and 0-1 vs. Boston College and Miami.
- Virginia plays Big East school Connecticut for the first time next month

NON-CONFERENCE HOME GAMES

- This is one of two home games against non-conference opponents this season
- In two weeks the Cavaliers host Connecticut
- Virginia has won nine of its last 10 non-conference home games going back to 2002
- Overall, the Cavaliers have won 34 of their last 43 non-conference games at home going back to 1987.
- Under Al Groh Virginia is 11-3 at home in non-conference games and 31-9 in all home games

UNDER THE LIGHTS

- This game is the Cavaliers' first home night game in nearly a year
- The first night game played at Scott Stadium occurred on Oct. 9, 1982. Portable lights were trucked in from Iowa for the Clemson game that season. The Tigers won 48-0.

- Virginia is 21-13-1 in home night games, including 6-3 under Al Groh
- Virginia has won its last four home night games dating back to 2003

LONG TIME NO SEE

- Pittsburgh is playing in Charlottesville for the first time since 1953, a span of 54 years
- This is the fourth-longest period of time between games in Charlottesville in the history of the UVa program

FORMER NFL HEAD COACHES MEET

- This is the third week in a row Virginia head coach Al Groh, a former NFL head coach, goes up against another erstwhile NFL head coach
- Groh was the New York Jets head coach in 2000, while Pittsburgh is coached by Dave Wannstedt, one-time Chicago Bears and Miami Dolphins head coach
- Two weeks ago Groh coached against North Carolina's Butch Davis, former coach of the Cleveland Browns
- Last week Groh was matched up with one-time Dallas Cowboy head coach Chan Gailey, now at Georgia Tech
- Overall, this is one of 10 college games this season pitting former NFL coaches against each other; currently there are 12 former NFL head coaches who are Football Bowl Subdivision head coaches.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

- One characteristic of this year's Cavalier squad is its ability to win the close games
- Virginia has won the last two games by a combined seven points
- All three wins have been by a combined 18 points
- UVa's average margin of victory is currently 6.0 points
- Of the 15 teams that have an average win margin of seven points or less, only UVa and Bowling Green have winning records

EIGHTEEN RETURNING STARTERS

- Virginia features 18 returning starters this season, eight on offense, 10 on defense
- Both kicking specialists also return
- Only two schools have more returning starters: UCLA-20, Utah St.-19
- This is UVa's most returning starters since the 1989 team also had 18. That squad won the school's first ACC championship.
- The eight returnees on offense are Virginia's most since 2003 (9).
- Virginia is one of nine schools to return as many as 10 defensive starters. Utah State returns all 11. Virginia ranked 17th in the country in total defense last season.
- This is the first time since 1977 Virginia has returned as many as 10 defensive starters.

FIVE CAVALIERS COMPETE AS GRAD STUDENTS

- Five Cavaliers have already received their undergraduate degrees and will be participating as graduate students this season.
- The list of grad students and their undergraduate degrees include:
 - NT Allen Billyk (economics)
 - G Ian-Yates Cunningham (psychology)
 - LB Jermaine Dias (sociology)
 - C Jordy Lipsey (sociology)
 - G Gordie Sammis (government)
- UVa has had 104 players play as grad students in the past 18 seasons.
- Only six schools have more players playing as grad students that Virginia

THREE WALK-ONS IN STARTING LINE-UP

- With three walk-on players in the starting line-up this season, it will be the first time in 10 years so many have started for UVa
- In 1997, DE Patrick Kerney, WR Bryan Owen, and CB/S Stephen Phelan started six games together.
- Only five schools have more starters who came as walk-ons that UVa. Florida International leads the way with five in its starting line-up, while Central Michigan, Colorado, Florida Atlantic and Utah all have four.

WALK-ON SUCCESS

- The starting line-up features three players who joined the program as walk-ons.
 - ILB Jon Copper
 - S Byron Glaspy
 - WR Staton Jobe
- Copper was an undersized high schooler in Roanoke, Va., who spent a post grad year

at nearby Fork Union Military Academy. He redshirted his freshman year (2004) and played mostly special teams the following season. Last year he worked his way into the starting line-up and was the leading tackler

- Glaspy stepped out of the student body and joined the team during the spring of 2005. He moved into the starting line-up for the final four games that season
- Jobe camped at UVa while in high school. A sprint champ in high school in Austin, Texas, he redshirted last fall, but moved into the receiver spot vacated following the injury to Kevin Ogletree.

OTHER UVA WALK-ONS

- Virginia has had remarkable success with walk-ons through the years
- Al Groh, a walk-on himself at UVa, says his philosophy is to play the players who give the team the best chance to win
- Notable former UVa walk-ons include:
 - all-time leading scorer PK Connor Hughes
 - NFL Pro Bowler DE Patrick Kerney
 - NFL 1000-yard WR Patrick Jeffers
 - Academic All-American DB Stephen Phelan
 - Two-year starting FB Kase Luzar
 - Current ST standout Josh Zidenberg

FIVE TRUE FROSH SEE THE FIELD

- 54 players have played as true freshmen under head coach Al Groh, including 25 on this year's roster
- NT Nate Collins was the only true freshman to play last season. The rest of his recruiting class was redshirted.
- In the opener vs. Wyoming, LS Danny Aiken, WR Dontrelle Inman and QB Peter Lalich played
- Lalich got in for the final series to become the first true freshman QB to play for UVa since Dan Ellis in 1997
- CB Ras-I Dowling joined this list after seeing plenty of special teams action vs. Duke
- LB Jared Detrick saw action on the kickoff, kickoff return and punt return squads against North Carolina to become the fifth true freshman to play this season

BIG PLAYS RETURN

- Virginia has already gotten bigger plays in just four games from the offense and on special teams than all of last season
- Andrew Pearman returned a kickoff 67 yards vs. Wyoming, UVa's longest return in two years
- Vic Hall had a 67-yard punt return to set up UVa's first TD vs. Duke, the team's longest in three years
- Cedric Peerman raced 58 yards for TD in the Duke game for UVa's longest run from scrimmage in two years
- Peerman added a 38-yard run to his resume against North Carolina
- Virginia had only one running play of 30+ yards all last season, a 36-yard run by QB Jameel Sewell, and has had two this season

OFFENSIVE LINE RETURNS INTACT

- Virginia is one of six teams that return all five offensive line starters from a year ago.
- This is the first time this has happened for the Cavaliers since 2004.
- That season UVa led the ACC in rushing with an average of 242.8 yards, an improvement of more than 112 yards per game.
- LG Branden Albert, a preseason All-ACC choice, shares the team lead with 28 career starts
- Two members of the O-Line have already earned their degrees: RG Ian-Yates Cunningham and C Jordy Lipsey
- LT Eugene Monroe was the top line recruit in the country in 2005
- RT Will Barker was a second-team Freshman All-American last year

OFFENSE PICKING UP DURING WIN STREAK

- Virginia had just 100 yards of offense, including -3 yards rushing, in the opener at Wyoming
- During the current three-game winning streak, the offense is doing much better
- UVa has scored 20+ points in the last three games for the first time in nearly a year
- The chart below shows the increased production in the last three games

SEWELL TOPS 64 PERCENT

- Jameel Sewell has put a rough season opener behind him and played a key role as the team has won its last three games
- He has completed at least 64 percent of his passes in each of the three games
- During the winning streak he has hit 64.3 percent of his throws, while averaging 111.0 ypg and tossing two TD passes
- Has not thrown an interception in his last 56 pass attempts, the third-longest streak of his young career
- Had two streaks last season of 66 attempts without an interception

PEERMAN LEADS ACC IN RUSHING

- Junior Cedric Peerman won the starting tailback job with an impressive preseason
- After leading the team in rushing vs. Wyoming with a very modest 18 yards, he has erupted since then
- Rushed for 137 yards three weeks ago vs. Duke on just 19 carries
- He scored on a 58-yard run in the first quarter for UVa's longest running play since Michael Johnson bolted 70 yards for a touchdown against Syracuse in 2005
- Exploded for a career-high 186 yards two weeks ago vs. North Carolina on 30 carries and was named ACC Offensive Back of the Week for the first time in his career
- His 186 yards are the most by a UVa player since 2004 (Alvin Pearman 223 vs. Duke)
- Bullied his way for 138 yards against Georgia Tech, a team that was allowing an average of 56.0 yards per game coming in
- First Cavalier since Pearman in 2004 to have three straight 100-yard games
- Leads the ACC in rushing with an average of 119.8 ypg, ranked 16th nationally
- Rushed for 461 yards combined in just the last three games, more than his career total (408) up to that point
- Ran indoor and outdoor track (sprints, relays) with the UVa track team, including the prestigious Penn Relays in the spring

BIG PLAYS FROM PASSING GAME

- Through the first three games of the season, the passing game had just one play of more than 20 yards, a 25-yard reception by TB Cedric Peerman
- The wide receivers and tight ends had a big day in leading the team to the win last week vs. Georgia Tech
- The passing game produced five plays of at least 20 yards:
 - 45-yard play by TE Tom Santi
 - 23-yard play by TE Jonathan Stupar
 - 20-yard play by Santi
 - 31-yard play by WR Dontrelle Inman
 - 26-yard touchdown by WR Staton Jobe
- Santi's 45-yard reception set up UVa's first TD, while Stupar's third down catch kept UVa's second TD drive going
- The Cavaliers' 233 yards passing vs. the Yellow Jackets are their most since the Maryland game last year, a span of nine games

TIGHT END U

- UVa can easily be called "Tight End U" under head coach Al Groh
- Seniors Tom Santi and Jonathan Stupar, and junior John Phillips form one of best units in country
- Redshirt freshman Joe Torchia is also an excellent prospect
- Pittsburgh Steeler standout Heath Miller won John Mackey Trophy in 2004 as nation's top TE
- Santi's 76 career receptions lead team, rank fifth by a TE in school history
- Stupar's 53 receptions are second on team, tied for 10th all-time by UVa TE
- Phillips has been primarily a blocker but is likely to be more involved in passing game
- UVa TEs have caught 345 passes for 3972 yards and 32 TDs since 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that time

SANTI NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Tight end Tom Santi was named the ACC Offensive Lineman of the Week for his play in the win over Duke to start UVa's three-game winning streak
- This is the first time he has received ACC Player of the Week honors
- Led the team in receiving with six receptions for 54 yards and two touchdowns in the Cavaliers' 11-point win
- Four of his six catches resulted in either a touchdown or first down, the best performance of his career
- Became the first UVa tight end to catch two touchdown passes in a game since Heath Miller did so against Akron in 2004
- In addition to his strong play as a receiver, he helped block for an offense that did not give up a single sack and rushed for almost 200 yards on the day
- 15 receptions are 12th in the country by a tight end

LALICH FIRST IN A DECADE

- Peter Lalich has appeared in every game this season
- Is the first true freshman to play QB at UVa since Dan Ellis in 1997
- Led team in passing vs. Duke with 131 yards, the sixth-highest total by a true freshman in school history
- Also tossed a 4-yard scoring pass to Tom Santi to cap a 15-play, 82-yard drive in the fourth quarter for UVa's final touchdown
- Since the restoration of freshman eligibility in 1972 only 12 true freshmen, including Lalich, have played QB for UVa
- Lalich's 260 yards passing are already third-most by a true freshman in school history

LONG MAKING ALL-AMERICAN PLAYS

- Defensive end Chris Long has been named to a host of preseason All-America lists
- On watch lists for several prestigious awards, including the Bednarik Award (nation's best defensive player), the Nagurski Award (outstanding defensive player) and the Ted Hendricks Award (defensive end of the year)
- Fourth among ACC defensive linemen in tackling last year with an average of 4.8 tpg
- Averaging 7.0 tackles per game this season, second among d-linemen in the ACC and tied for 18th overall
- Finished with seven tackles, including two sacks, against Wyoming
- Had six QB pressures vs. the Cowboys, the second-highest total of his career
- Has had three All-American performances in a row according to head coach Al Groh
- In the win over Duke he shared the team lead with eight tackles and had two sacks for the second game in a row
- Also had three QB pressures
- Made four tackles vs. North Carolina, including a sack for the third straight game
- Intercepted a pass early in the fourth quarter to set up what ultimately became UVa's game-winning field goal
- Led the team with nine tackles in the win over Georgia Tech, the second-highest total of his career
- He also had a sack for the fourth straight game and broke up two passes
- The last Cavalier to have a sack in five consecutive games was LB Darryl Blackstock in 2002
- Currently second in the country in sacks (1.50/g)

BILLYK MANS THE MIDDLE

- Senior nose tackle Allen Billyk was one of the team's most improved players in training camp according to head coach Al Groh
- After playing last season on bad ankles, he's been healthy this season
- Tied his career high with six tackles against Wyoming
- Followed that with five tackles vs. Duke
- Tied for 11th among ACC DT/NTs in tackling with an average of 3.3 tpg

FITZGERALD WREAKS HAVOC

- Jeffrey Fitzgerald blossomed last year as a redshirt freshman playing opposite Chris Long at defensive end
- Unanimous freshman All-American
- Averaged 5.3 tackles per game, top in nation among freshmen linemen
- Six sacks set UVa rookie record and ranked third in the country for freshmen
- 64 tackles led UVa linemen
- Third on team in tackling, averaging 6.8/g
- Third among ACC defensive linemen in tackling, tied for 21st overall
- Eight tackles and an interception against Wyoming
- Shared the team lead with Chris Long with eight tackles vs. Duke to tie his career high
- Six tackles in win over North Carolina, second-most on team, including his first sack
- Had a big game in win over Georgia Tech and earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors
- Three of five tackles resulted in a loss
- Returned an interception 25 yards for a touchdown, the second TD of his career
- Also forced a fumble with a sack
- Four career interceptions lead the team

- 58 QB pressures in last three seasons
- Closing in on the UVa top-10 list for both career sacks and career tackles for loss as shown by the charts below

- Reaching those goals on a consistent basis should make for a very successful season if history is any indication.
- Under Groh, Virginia is 23-6 (.793) when recording at least three sacks and 19-5 (.792) when forcing at least three turnovers
- The Cavaliers have won 19 of their last 22 games when dropping the quarterback three times and 17 of their 18 when getting at least three takeaways.

SINTIM BACK IN TOP SHAPE

- Junior OLB Clint Sintim said he reported to training camp in the best shape of his life
- Following a stellar rookie campaign in 2005, he was hindered by a shoulder injury last fall and had offseason surgery to correct the problem
- Was not a full go in the spring as a result
- Made a career-high 10 tackles vs. Wyoming
- Currently second on team behind Chris Long in career TFL (22) and QBS (8)

COPPER LEADS FOR FIRST TIME

- ILB Jon Copper led the team in tackles last season with 81 and was the team's leading tackler on six occasions
- Team leader once again averaging 7.25 tpg to rank in a tie for 16th in the ACC
- Has been remarkably consistent this season making at least seven tackles in every game
- Led the team for the first time this season against North Carolina two weeks ago
- Was second behind Chris Long with season-high eight tackles vs. Georgia Tech in the last game
- Had a productive game vs. Duke, finishing with a sack and his first career interception
- Became the first UVa linebacker with a sack and an interception in a game since Angelo Crowell did it vs. Clemson in 2001
- Had a big offseason, too, following the marriage to his wife, Holly

COOK HAS STAR POTENTIAL

- Junior Chris Cook is attempting to become the first UVa CB to earn first-team All-ACC honors since Ronde Barber did it three times from 1994-96
- At 6-2, 201, he has the size to be an exceptional cornerback and is a vastly underrated performer
- Led the secondary with 58 tackles last year
- Tied for the team lead among the team's DBs in tackling this season, averaging 5.3 tpg
- Eighth in tackling among ACC CBs
- Tied for second in ACC with four PBU
- Led team with 11 tackles, including five solos, vs. Wyoming

HALL LONE NEW DEFENSIVE STARTER

- Sophomore CB Vic Hall was one of the most dynamic quarterbacks during his high school career
- When he got to UVa he was moved to cornerback since the program was well-stocked with QBs
- Was expected to battle Mike Brown for the starting nod at cornerback, but a summer knee injury knocked Brown out of action
- Standout special teams performer who shared team lead with Brown with seven punt coverage tackles
- Made four tackles vs. Wyoming
- Got UVa off to a fast start on special teams against Duke
- Returned a punt 67 yards on the first touch of his career early in the game to set up UVa's first touchdown
- Finished with 80 punt returns yards, the most by a Cavalier in three years
- Finished with a career-high six tackles in win over North Carolina

GOULD SWITCHES APPROACH

- Placekicker Chris Gould has worked hard since last season on improving his accuracy to better his 11 of 19 performance of 2006
- He switched from a three-step to a two-step approach to help him, which is paying off according to Al Groh
- Made his first attempt from 42 yards vs. Wyoming
- Tied the school record with five field goals to propel his team to a 22-20 win over North Carolina (51, 28, 37, 48, 32) to earn ACC Specialist of the

Week honors

- His 51-yard field goal in the first quarter is the longest of his career and tied for the fifth-longest in school history
- Also had his first two touchbacks of the season on kickoffs
- 12th on UVa's all-time field goals list with 18
- Needs one field goal to tie Joe Jenkins and Billy Maxwell for 10th on UVa's field goals list
- Attended the Super Bowl last February to see his brother, Robbie, kick for the Chicago Bears

WEIGAND HAS RECORD-SETTING DAY

- PK Chris Gould isn't the only UVa kicking specialist to have a record-setting performance during the early part of the season
- Punter Ryan Weigand benefited from the "thin" air of Wyoming in the season opener
- He punted nine times for a 51.6-yard average and set a school record for best single-game average
- The previous record was 50.4 yards by Joel Dempsey against Wake Forest in 1986
- Weigand also set a school record for most punting yards in a game with 464, breaking Russ Henderson's record of 449 in 1977
- Weigand boomed six punts of at least 50 yards to become the first Cavalier punter to have so many in one game
- After the game Weigand admitted he felt the altitude added 5-7 yards per kick, but his last two (57, 61 yards) were into the wind
- Weigand is the nation's second-leading punter averaging 48.6 yards
- He has eight punts of 50+ yards already this season, the most by a Cavalier booter since Mike Abrams had 16 in 2001
