#### TV COVERAGE

- ABC/ESPN2 is televising the game.
- Terry Gannon (play-by-play) and David Norrie (color analysis) have the call.

#### 113TH RENEWAL OF THE SOUTH'S OLDEST RIVALRY

- North Carolina holds a 56-52-4 advantage in the all-time series that dates back to 1892. You may notice a difference

in the series record between the two schools because of the game in 1956 that North Carolina forfeited for using an ineligible player.

- The Cavaliers have faced the Tar Heels more times than any other school (Virginia Tech is next at 89 games).

#### CAVALIERS HAVE DOMINATED SERIES OF LATE

- The Cavaliers have won five of the last six meetings and eight of the last 10.
- UNC has not won in Charlottesville since 1981 (17-14), losing 13 straight times; in that time the Cavaliers have won five times in Chapel Hill.
- UVa squeaked out a 22-20 win in Chapel Hill last year.

### THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Virginia has won eight of 10 against North Carolina and has not lost to the Tar Heels in Charlottesville since 1981, a stretch of 13 games.
- Virginia has rushed for 200 yards in consecutive games for the first time since 2004 and scored 30 points in back-to-back contests for the first time since 2005.
- UVa has posted its best offensive totals is nearly a year in each of the last two games (427 vs. Maryland, 430 vs. East Carolina).
- Clint Sintim ranks fifth nationally and leads the ACC in sacks this season. He also is the national leader in sacks among linebackers.
- Virginia has had 17 players make their first career start this season while 22 have made their first college appearance.

**ACC INJURY POLICY**

The ACC has a new injury release policy this year. On each Monday during the season, the school announces any players who are out for the season or scheduled to have surgery.

No other announcements regarding player injuries will be made until the end of practice on Thursday or two days prior to the next football game (Tuesday for Thursday game, Thursday for Saturday). On that day, within 90 minutes of the end of practice, injured players' playing status for the next game will be announced in one of five categories:

- Definitely will play
- Probable
- Questionable
- Doubtful
- Out

**THE SOUTH'S OLDEST RIVALRY**

- This is the 113th meeting in the long history of the Virginia-North Carolina series, the South's oldest rivalry.
- The rivalry is tied for the fifth longest in Football Bowl Subdivision history and was the seventh series in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history to reach 100 meetings with the 1995 game.
- The two schools have met every season since 1919 and there have been only four seasons since 1900 when they did not meet (1906, 1909 and 1917-18, when football was postponed at both schools because of World War I).

**MORE ON THE UNC-UVA RIVALRY**

- In the last meeting in Charlottesville in 2006, Virginia won 23-0, its first shutout of the Tar Heels in 82 years (7-0 UVA in 1924)
- Virginia is 24-21 all-time against UNC in Charlottesville, while the Tar Heels hold the advantage in Chapel Hill (29-11-3).
- Since 1982, Virginia is 18-7-1 against the Tar Heels.

**UVA VS. RANKED UNC TEAMS**

- Virginia is 4-11 all-time against ranked North Carolina teams (Associated Press poll).
- It has been more than 11 years since the last such meeting, a 48-20 Carolina win on Sept. 27, 1997, in Chapel Hill.
- That win snapped a four-game Virginia winning streak over ranked UNC teams.
- UVA's last win over a ranked Tar Heel squad was Nov. 16, 1996 (20-17 in Charlottesville).

**GROH'S TAR HEEL CONNECTION**

- Virginia head coach Al Groh was the linebackers coach at North Carolina from 1973-77.
- While there, he coached future NFL Hall of Famer Lawrence Taylor, among others.

**2007: VIRGINIA 22, NORTH CAROLINA 20**

- Cedric Peerman shredded the UNC defense for a career-high 186 yards and a touchdown, and Chris Gould tied a school record with five field goals as Virginia held off North Carolina, 22-20, last year at Kenan Stadium.
- North Carolina marched 85 yards to score on QB T.J. Yates' 2-yard pass to Richard Quinn with 1:57 left, but Yates' 2-point conversion pass was batted down by Nate Collins at the line of scrimmage.
- Peerman also caught three passes for 37 yards and finished with 223 all-purpose yards.

**THE MOST OFFENSE TYPICALLY WINS**

- One of the factors that can be used to predict a winner of this game is looking at the team with the most rushing yards and total offense.
- Since 1940 the winning team has outrushed the loser 53 of 65 times, with one game featuring the same yardage for both.
- Similarly the winning team has had more offense 54 times and been out-gained just 12 times since 1940.
- The loser has outgained the winner just five times since 1975, but it has happened three times in the last eight years, including last year. [In both instances above the 1956 (forfeit) and 1984 (tie) games aren't included.]

**CAVALIERS HOLD UNC OFFENSE IN CHECK ...**

- One of the keys to UVA's recent success has been an ability to keep the Tar Heel offense in check.
- Since 1979, North Carolina has scored

more than 27 points just twice (1997, 2001). In contrast, the Tar Heels topped 27 points seven times between 1970-78.

- Also since 1979, the Tar Heels have managed to score more than three touchdowns only twice (when they scored six in 1997 and four in 2002), while Virginia has done so three of the last five years.

**... ON THE GROUND, IN PARTICULAR**

- North Carolina's rushing offense is another telltale sign of predicting a winner. The Tar Heels have averaged 238.8 yards in their last six wins dating back to 1983 but have averaged just 122.4 yards in their 18 losses since then (a tie in 1984 is not included).
- The Virginia defense has been even better against the run since 1993, holding the Tar Heels to an average of 114.5 yards rushing per game, while winning 11 of the last 15 meetings.
- Since 1996, UNC has scored just five rushing touchdowns with two coming in 1997. In contrast, Virginia has scored 22 times on the ground since then.
- In the last 12 games, UNC's offense has scored 21 touchdowns, with nine coming in two games (1997, 2002), while the defense has scored five touchdowns (all on interceptions).

**TURNOVERS ALSO MAKE DIFFERENCE**

- Since 1982, the Cavaliers are 13-2-1 when committing fewer turnovers than the Tar Heels. (The losses occurred in 1995 and 2001, while the tie was in '84).
- Last year, North Carolina committed three turnovers which led to six points in the 22-20 loss to UVA.
- On the other hand, North Carolina is 4-2 when committing fewer turnovers.
- There have been four games since 1982 where each team committed the same number of miscues and Virginia has won three (1985, '88, 2003).

**FORMER NFL COACHES SQUARE OFF**

- Former NFL head coaches Al Groh and Butch Davis face off for the second time in college Saturday.
- Groh coached the New York Jets (2000), while Davis coached the Cleveland Browns (2001-04).
- Groh faced off with former NFL head coach Pete Carroll of Southern California this year in the season opener.

- Groh's Cavaliers also played three teams led by former NFL coaches last year – North Carolina (Davis), Georgia Tech (Chan Gailey) and Pittsburgh (Dave Wannstedt).
- UVa won all three of those games.

**UVA CLEANS UP IN ACC POW HONORS**

- Virginia players claimed half of the ACC's player of the week honors this week.
- Cedric Peerman was named Offensive Back of the Week after rushing for a season-high 173 yards on just 16 carries and scoring twice. He also caught a career-high eight passes for another 26 yards. His 173 yards are the second-most by an ACC player this season.
- Eugene Monroe was named Offensive Lineman of the Week after playing every snap and grading out at a team-leading 88 percent, his highest grade this season and the second-highest by any Virginia player in 2008.
- Matt Conrath earned Rookie of the Week laurels. He sacked ECU QB early in the fourth quarter and forced a fumble, which was recovered by UVa. He also broke up a pass and graded out at 85 percent.

**FIVE TRUE FRESHMEN CRACK LINEUP**

- PK Robert Randolph became the fifth true freshman to play for UVa this season after seeing action in the fourth quarter vs. East Carolina.
- He is joined by P Jimmy Howell, OL Austin Pasztor, LB Cam Johnson and DB Rodney McLeod.
- Johnson made his debut vs. Connecticut, while Howell and Pasztor each saw action in the season opener vs. Southern California. McLeod played on the opening kickoff against vs. Duke and also played several plays from scrimmage.

**PASZTOR FIRST SINCE 2005 TO START ON O-LINE AS TRUE FRESHMAN**

- True freshman Austin Pasztor made his first career start against Maryland.
- He became the first true freshman to start on the Cavaliers' offensive line since Branden Albert in 2005.

**DEVLIN BECOMES LATEST FIRST-TIME STARTER**

- Redshirt freshman TE Andrew Devlin started last Saturday vs. East Carolina as part of UVa's two tight end set, becoming the 17th Cavalier to make the first start of his career this season.
- There have been plenty on each side of the ball, with nine first-timers on offense and eight on defense.

**MORE ON THE FIRST-TIMERS**

- 22 Cavaliers have seen their first career action in the six games this season after kickers Chris Hinkebein and Robert Randolph played vs. East Carolina.
- 14 made their first appearances vs. USC and eight have followed suit in the last five games.
- On Offense: T Landon Bradley, WR Kris Burd, TE Andrew Devlin, WR Jared Green, C Anthony Mihota, G Austin Pasztor, QB Marc Verica, FB Curt Orshoski.
- On Defense: DE Nick Conrath, DL John-Kevin Dolce, LB Terence Fells-Danzer, NT Nick Jenkins, LB Cam Johnson, CB Dom Joseph, DB Rodney McLeod, CB Chase Minnifield, S Corey Mosley, DE Zane Parr.
- On Special Teams: P Jimmy Howell, PK Yannick Reyerling, PK Chris Hinkebein, PK Robert Randolph.

**FOUR HOOS HAIL FROM NORTH CAROLINA**

- Virginia has four players who hail from North Carolina, including two Durham natives, S Brandon Woods and WR Maurice Covington, who each went to Southern Durham High School.
- Chris Hinkebein (Providence) and Rico Bell (Vance) each are from Charlotte.
- In contrast, North Carolina has six players from the state of Virginia.

**CAVALIERS SECOND YOUNGEST TEAM IN ACC**

- Virginia has 72 freshmen or sophomores on its roster. The Cavaliers and Virginia Tech rank second to Georgia Tech

for the youngest team in the ACC.

- Georgia Tech has 75 players that are either freshmen or sophomores.
- North Carolina (68), Duke (66) and Boston College (64) rank fourth through sixth, respectively.

**MORE ON THE YOUTH MOVEMENT**

- Virginia has just 16 seniors on its roster.
- That total is among the fewest in the country – only 17 programs have fewer seniors on their rosters.
- Central Michigan and Toledo each have just 10 seniors on their rosters.

**VIRGINIA AVERAGES FEWEST PENALTY YARDS PER GAME SINCE '01**

- Virginia has been the ACC's least-penalized team during Al Groh's eight years as head coach.
- UVa has averaged just 45.0 penalty yards per game since 2001 and is averaging 46.8 penalty yards through the first six games this year.

**UVA HAS PLAYED MOST GAMES OF ANY ACC SCHOOL**

- Virginia has played more football games than any other ACC school.
- The Cavaliers have played 1,186 games in this, the 119th season of UVa football.
- During that time, Virginia has compiled a 611-527-48 record, a winning percentage of .535.
- North Carolina ranks next among ACC schools with 1,169 games played in 118 seasons. UVa is ranked sixth among all NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision teams in games played and 13th overall among all Division I teams.
- Penn (1,287) has played the most games overall.

**TOUGH SLATE OUT OF CONFERENCE**

- UVA's first three opponents (USC, Richmond, UConn) are a combined 13-5 this year after earning 31 victories a year ago.
- USC is currently ranked No. 6 nationally and UConn is receiving votes, while Richmond was the FCS No. 1 squad prior to its upset loss to Villanova three weeks ago.
- East Carolina, UVA's opponent last week, was nationally ranked after wins over Virginia Tech and West Virginia but has since dropped out of the polls.

**OVERALL SCHEDULE ALSO STRONG**

- All of Virginia's remaining six opponents are at .500 or better this year.
- UVA's opponents combined to go 91-64 (.587) last year.
- UVA's opponents' 2007 winning percentage ranks 19th nationally.
- Eight of the 12 opponents had .500-plus records and played in bowls in 2007.
- UVA's schedule was ranked 10th toughest in the country recently by ESPN.com.

**YEARS SINCE CONSECUTIVE LOSING SEASONS (SUB-.500 SEASONS)**

- Virginia has gone 25 years since suffering consecutive losing seasons (1980-82).
- The Cavaliers' streak is the 16th longest in the nation.

**LOTS OF NEW FACES**

- UVA features just 10 returning starters – five on each side of the ball.
- It marks the fewest returning starters

since 1986 (nine).

- Only seven schools have fewer returning starters (Air Force, Army, Hawaii have fewest with eight).
- Cavaliers also is breaking in a new placekicker and punter this year, but returning long snapper Danny Aiken and holder Vic Hall.

**WHO'S BACK – BY THE NUMBERS**

- Thirty lettermen return, the program's fewest since 1986 (29).
- UVA lost 42 percent (10 of 24) of its offensive lettermen.
- Cavaliers also lost 43 percent (11 of 26) of their defensive lettermen.

**CAPTAINS HAVE VIRGINIA FLAVOR**

- All four UVA captains hail from Virginia.
- TE John Phillips (Warm Springs), TB Cedric Peerman (Gladys), OLB Clint Sintim (Woodbridge) and CB Vic Hall (Gretna) will serve as 2008 captains.
- Phillips started eight games last season (17 rec., 193 yards, 2 TD).
- Peerman missed the second half of the season because of foot injury; was the ACC's leading rusher at the time.
- Sintim was the team's third-leading tackler and had nine sacks to lead linebackers nationally.
- Hall, a junior, started all 13 games in 2007 and made 58 tackles.

**MORE WHITE-KNUCKLERS IN STORE?**

- Virginia won five games by two points or fewer last year, becoming the first team in NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision history to win five games by one or two points in a season.
- The 1971 Columbia team held the previous record with four wins by one or two points.
- Six of the Cavaliers' nine wins last year were by six points or fewer.
- UVA's six wins by six points or fewer were most in the nation (Memphis, New Mexico – four).
- It was only the third time in ACC history a team has won six games by six points or fewer during the regular season (North Carolina, 1976; Maryland, 2006).

- Three Cavaliers have already received their undergraduate degrees and will participate as graduate students this season.
- The list of grad students and their undergraduate degrees includes: QB Scott Deke (economics), S Byron Glaspay (economics) and TB Cedric Peerman (sociology).
- UVA has had 107 players play as grad students in the past 19 seasons.

**LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD**

- With back-to-back 30-point performances, Virginia racked up 30 points in consecutive games for the first time since 2005.
- In '05, UVA put up 38 vs. Duke and 33 against Maryland (33) in back-to-back contests.
- UVA has not scored 30+ points in three straight games since 2004 when it did so in five straight games to start the season.

**BIG-PLAY CAVALIERS**

- Virginia's offense has showed a big-play ability of late with five plays from scrimmage of 30 yards or more in the last two games.
- UVA had three plays of 30 or more yards in the ECU game, with Cedric Peerman running for 79- and 60-yard touchdowns and Kevin Ogletree catching a 30-yard TD pass.
- The Cavaliers had no plays of 30 or more yards in their first four games – the longest play was a 25-yard Kevin Ogletree reception in the Richmond game.

**HOOS GO FOR 200 YARDS RUSHING IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES**

- Virginia has rushed for 200 or more yards in consecutive games for the first time since 2004.
- The Cavaliers last ran for 200 in back-to-back games vs. Miami (221) and Georgia Tech (207) on Nov. 13 and 20, respectively in 2004.
- UVA rushed for 200+ yards in four straight games that year.

- Peerman has rushed for 100-plus yards in consecutive games with 110 vs. Maryland and 173 against East Carolina.
- He is averaging 7.2 yards per carry this season and ranks fifth in the ACC with 75.8 rushing yards per game.
- Peerman also has set career highs for receptions in each of the last two weeks with seven vs. Maryland and eight against East Carolina.
- He ranks sixth in the ACC this season with 4.4 receptions per game and leads ACC running backs in receptions.

**NOTING PEERMAN'S BIG DAY**

- Cedric Peerman rushed for a season-best 173 yards last week vs. East Carolina. It was just 13 yards off his career high of 186, set last year at North Carolina.
- Peerman's 79-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was the longest rush of his career.
- It also tied for the seventh-longest rushing play in UVa history, the fifth-longest rush for a TD in UVa history and the third-longest UVa run for a TD in Scott Stadium history.
- He became just the second player in UVa history to post two runs of 60 or more yards (79, 60). The other was John Papit vs. Washington & Lee in 1948 (63, 60).
- The last UVa player to have two runs of 50+ yards in a game was Barry Word vs. Georgia Tech in 1985 (79-TD, 52).

**PEERMAN PILES UP YARDAGE**

- Cedric Peerman now has 1,354 career rushing yards -- 26th all time at Virginia.
- Next up on the rushing chart: Kevin Morgan (1985-88), who had 1,504 career rushing yards.
- Peerman is just the 36th player to go over 1,000 in a career at UVa.

**OGLETREE HAS 1000 IN SIGHT**

- Kevin Ogletree has 992 career receiving yards going into the UNC game.
- He needs eight yards to become the 28th player in school history with 1,000 in a career.

**OGLETREE CRACKS CENTURY MARK AGAIN ...**

- Kevin Ogletree earned his third career 100-yard receiving day vs. Maryland, with

exactly 100 yards.

- He also had 103 yards receiving Sept. 6 vs. Richmond.
- Ironically, Ogletree's other 100-yard performance came two years ago in UVa's home game vs. Maryland (133 yards).

**... AND INCHING TOWARD ANOTHER CENTURY MARK**

- Kevin Ogletree also has 90 career receptions and is tied for 17th all-time in receptions at UVa with Michael McGrew (2001-04).
- He needs five receptions to tie for 16th place all-time (Deyon Williams, 2003-06) and seen to reach 14th (Terrence Wilkins, 1995-98 and Tom Santi, 2004-07).
- He is looking to become just the 14th player in school history to catch 100 passes in a career.

**OGLETREE CONTINUES STREAK OF MULTIPLE RECEPTIONS**

- Kevin Ogletree had four receptions against East Carolina and now has at least two receptions in 17 straight games, dating to the start of 2006.
- He leads the team with 31 receptions for 383 yards (63.8 yards per game).
- Ogletree ranks fourth in the ACC in receptions per game (5.17) and third in yards per game (63.8).

**OGLETREE GUNNING FOR THREE 100-YARD RECEIVING GAMES IN SEASON**

- With two 100-yard games already this year, Kevin Ogletree is in line to become just the 10th player in UVa history to have three 100-yard receiving games in a season.

**VERICA TURNS THINGS AROUND**

- After a tough outing at Duke, Virginia quarterback Marc Verica has made two straight strong starts at home.
- Against Maryland, he set career highs for completions (25), yards (226) and touchdowns (2) and also scrambled for his first rushing TD (five yards in the second quarter).
- Verica became the first UVa QB in nearly three years to complete 25 passes in a game (Marques Hagans vs. Minnesota, 2005 Music City Bowl), then matched it the following week vs. ECU.
- Verica also connected on his longest career pass, 51 yards, to Kevin Ogletree for a TD against Maryland.

**TRICKY, TRICKY**

- Scott Deke hit John Phillips on a 12-yard TD toss on a fake field goal Saturday.
- It was UVa's first pass out of a field goal formation since Matt Schaub threw a 10-yard pass to Heath Miller for a first down against Virginia Tech in 2003.
- It also marked Deke's first career TD pass.

**MONROE ON KIPER'S BIG BOARD**

- Senior T Eugene Monroe currently is No. 1 on ESPN's Mel Kiper's 2009 Big Board for NFL Draft prospects.
- Monroe also has been named to the Outland and Lombardi trophy watch lists, while Sintim is on the Nagurski Award watch list.
- Monroe graded out at 88 percent last week vs. East Carolina – his highest mark of the season.
- Monroe received honorable mention All-ACC recognition last season and was on several preseason All-ACC squads this year.

**TIGHT END U**

- UVa TEs have caught 437 passes for 4,911 yards and 38 TDs since Al Groh arrived in 2001, by far the best figures in the ACC in that span (nearly double).

**NOTING UVA ATHLETICS**

**UVA ATHLETICS FINISHES 17TH IN DIRECTORS' CUP**

- Virginia finished 17th in the final 2007-08 U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup competition for Division I schools.
- It was the 15th-consecutive year (since program's inception) that UVa has recorded a top-30 finish.
- UVa is one of 15 schools to rank in the top 30 of the final Directors' Cup standings in all 15 years of the program's existence.
- Teams or individuals in 21 of Virginia's 25 athletics programs advanced to post-season competition in 2007-08, including 19 in NCAA championship events.

**2007-08 UVA ATHLETICS HIGHLIGHTS**

- The men's tennis and men's lacrosse teams both reached the semifinals of the NCAA Championships.
- The women's rowing team placed fifth overall at the NAAs.
- Cavalier men's tennis player Somdev Devvarman repeated as NCAA individual champion, becoming the 13th player in the 124-year history of the event to win consecutive titles.
- Seven UVa coaches earned eight ACC Coach of the Year awards in their respective sports: Kim Lewellen (women's golf); Jason Dunn (men's cross country); Al Groh (football); Mark Bernardino (men's swimming & diving and women's swimming & diving); Kevin Sauer (rowing); Julie Myers (women's lacrosse) and Brian Boland (men's tennis).
- Women's basketball head coach Debbie Ryan was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in June, and men's lacrosse coach Dom Starsia will be inducted into the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame in November.
- Virginia had six student-athletes that were selected for the ACC award recognizing exemplary levels of academic and athletic achievement. That group included senior tight end Tom Santi, who won the Tatum Award as the top football student-athlete.
- There are nine people with direct connections to UVa that were participants or coaches in the Beijing Olympics. Women's eight rower Lindsay Shoop and women's soccer player Angela Hucles won gold medals.

- Senior John Phillips ranks first among ACC TEs this season in receptions per game (25 receipts, 233 yards) and is second on the team in receiving yards this year.
- Redshirt freshman TE Andrew Devlin also has made his first three career catches in the last two games.

- The Cavaliers are tied for second in the ACC and 11th in the FBS with three sacks per game (18 sacks).

- With two sacks vs. East Carolina, Clint Sintim now has 24 career sacks and eight this season to lead linebackers nationally.
- His 24 career sacks are the most for any current linebacker in the country (no LB has more than 15.5).
- It also is tied for fourth nationally among all players nationally.
- He is tied for fourth in UVa history with Patrick Kerney (1995-98).

- He also is an electrifying punt returner who ranks seventh in the ACC this season (6.1 average). He had had 230 punt return yards in 2007 – most by a Cavalier since 2004.

**DEFENSE RECORDS ANOTHER SHUTOUT**

- UVA's shutout vs. Maryland was the program's ninth since 2003 and second this season.
- The Cavaliers' last three wins have come by shutout, 16-0 Sept. 6 vs. Richmond and 48-0 at Miami on Nov. 10, 2007.
- It marks the first time since the start of the 1952 season that three straight UVA wins have come via shutouts.
- UVA has recorded at least one shutout every season since 2003.

**UVA SECOND IN SHUTOUTS SINCE 2001**

- Virginia is second in the ACC in shutouts since 2001, Al Groh's first year at UVA.
- The Cavaliers have nine shutouts, second only to Virginia Tech, which has 13 since 2001.
- Boston College (six) and Miami (five) are the only other schools with more than four shutouts in the last eight seasons.

**PRUETT DEBUTS AS D-COORDINATOR**

- UVA's defense is guided by first-year defensive coordinator Bob Pruett.
- A longtime friend of Al Groh, Pruett has 40 years of coaching experience.
- Pruett won the 1996 I-AA National Championship and five conference titles as head coach at Marshall (1996-2004).

**WALK-ON SUCCESS**

- Four players who originally joined the program as walk-ons are have or are vying for starting positions:
  - ILB Jon Copper
  - S Byron Glaspy
  - WR Staton Jobe
  - WR Cary Koch
- All four have earned scholarships during their time at UVA.

**OTHER UVA WALK-ONS**

- Virginia has had remarkable success with walk-ons through the years.
- Al Groh, a walk-on himself at UVA, says

his philosophy is to play the players who give the team the best chance to win.

- Notable former UVa walk-ons include:
  - All-time leading scorer PK Connor Hughes
  - NFL Pro Bowl DE Patrick Kerney
  - NFL 1,000-yard WR Patrick Jeffers

#### **THORNTON LIVING ON THE LAWN**

- Punter John Thornton will live on The Lawn in 2008. This is one of the most prestigious honors at UVa. He is living in Room No. 4, matching his uniform number.
- Just over 100 students are selected based on academic and service merit. Thornton is one of two UVa student-athletes living on The Lawn this year, joining baseball pitcher Andrew Carraway.

#### **REYERING MAKES FOOTBALL DEBUT**

- Yannick Reyering became the first UVa soccer player since Jeff Gaffney (1986) to score as a member of the football team.
- He is 4-for-7 in field goals and has kicked 11 PATs this season.
- Reyering also has handled kickoff duties.
- The USC contest marked the first time Reyering ever played in a football game.
- Gaffney, the only player to have his UVa soccer number retired, led the team with 53 points (17-17 XP, 12-16 FG) in 1986.
- Reyering was first-team All-ACC pick in 2007 (13 goals, four game-winning goals).
- He is a three-time All-ACC honoree; he led UVa in scoring all three years.
- He netted 39 goals and 10 assists during his decorated career before suffering season-ending knee injury prior to 2007 ACC Tournament.
- He led UVa to College Cup (final four of men's soccer) in 2006.

#### **NEW LOOK TO KICKING GAME**

- Virginia is breaking in new kickers and punters this season.
- It is the first time since 2002 that UVa has had a new kicker and punter in the same year.
- In 2002, Tom Hagan took over as punter and Kurt Smith as kicker, although Connor Hughes took over as PK midway through season.

They have different styles, but if you look at their stats from last year, they compare.
