ABOUT THE GAME

- ♦ After being one of only two teams (Florida International) in the nation to not play on the opening weekend, No. 17 TCU makes its 2009 season debut when it travels to Virginia.
- ♦ The Horned Frogs are facing their first ACC opponent since a 31-10 loss to North Carolina in 1997, the year before TCU head coach Gary Patterson arrived on campus as defensive coordinator.
- ♦ Two of TCU's opening three games are against ACC competition. The Frogs travel to Clemson on Sept. 26.
- ♦ TCU is 11-3 in its last 14 games against teams from leagues with automatic BCS bids, including a 5-2 mark versus Big 12 opponents the last four seasons.
- ♦ The Sept. 12 date marks the latest TCU has opened a season since 1986, when it posted a 48-31 win at Tulane on Sept. 13.
- ♦ The Virginia contest begins a stretch that will see TCU play its regular season over 12 consecutive Saturdays.

SEASON-OPENING NOTABLES

- ♦ TCU is opening on the road for the seventh time in nine seasons under head coach Gary Patterson.
- ♦ The Frogs have won their last six season openers. It's the first time TCU has won six straight season openers since 1940-45. The school record for consecutive wins in season openers is 17 (1920-36).
- ♦ TCU is 6-2 in season debuts under head coach Gary Patterson. Overall, the Frogs are 66-37-9 in openers with a 27-24-4 mark in road games.
- ♦ The Frogs have a four-game winning streak in road season openers, posting victories at Tulane (38-35, 2003), Oklahoma (17-10, 2005), Baylor (17-7, 2006) and New Mexico (26-3, 2008).
- ♦ TCU has not allowed a touchdown in its last two season openers and has surrendered just two touchdowns and a total of 20 points in its past four openers (Oklahoma 10, 2005; Baylor 7, 2006; Baylor 0, 2007; New Mexico 3, 2008).

SERIES HISTORY

- ♦ TCU and Virginia are meeting for just the second time in their history.
- ♦ The only previous game was a 20-10 Cavalier victory in the 1994 Independence Bowl.
- ♦ The lone Frog to have been a part of that game was tight ends coach/special teams coordinator Dan Sharp. He was the TCU tight ends coach in 1994 under former head coach Pat Sullivan.
- ♦ The next meeting between TCU and Virginia will take place during the 2012 campaign when the Cavaliers come to Fort Worth.

MILESTONE WATCH

- ♦ A Frog victory would be the 74th for Gary Patterson at TCU, enabling him to tie Abe Martin (74-64-7, 1953-66) for second place on TCU's career win list. Dutch Meyer, coach of the Frogs' 1935 and 1938 national championship teams, is TCU's all-time winningest coach with a mark of 109-79-13 (1934-52).
- ♦ The Virginia game will be Patterson's 101st as head coach of the Frogs. The dean of Mountain West Conference coaches is 73-27 (.730) in eight seasons. His 100th contest on the TCU sideline was a 17-16 win over Boise State in the 2008 Poinsettia Bowl.

DID YOU KNOW?

- ♦ TCU's total enrollment of 8,668 is 58 percent female.
- ♦ TCU has just 3,625 male students. With approximately 120 players on the football roster, 3.2 percent of all males at TCU are on the sideline in uniform during home games. If Ohio State had the same ratio of male students on the football team, the Buckeye roster would have over 1,000 players.
- ♦ The estimated annual cost, including housing, books and fees, to attend TCU is \$38,930.
- ♦ TCU's Neeley School of Business is ranked 32nd nationally by *BusinessWeek* for U.S. undergraduate business programs.
- ♦ TCU's endowment is among the top 60 colleges in the United States.
- ♦ TCU has opened four new residence halls since Summer 2007. The Campus Commons project had an expense of \$100 million.
- ♦ Thirty percent of TCU's entering freshmen were in the top 10 of their high school graduating class.
- ♦ TCU's campus contains seven different schools and colleges and is 268 acres.
- ♦ TCU students represent 54 countries.
- ♦ ESPN previously named the Horned Frog the nation's No. 1 mascot. SuperFrog is currently one of 12 finalists in the 2009 Capital One All-America Mascot Challenge.
- ♦ The Horned Frog has been TCU's mascot longer than TCU has been the university's name. Four students helped make the decision in 1897, when AddRan Christian University (renamed TCU in 1902) was located in Waco.
- ♦ Famous TCU alumni include Betty Buckley (actress), Gordon England (Secretary of the U.S. Navy), Dan Jenkins (author/sports-writer), Eddie Bernice Johnson (congresswoman), Bob Lilly (Pro Football Hall of Fame member), Rod Roddy (Price is Right announcer), Bob Schieffer (CBS newsman and co-host of Face the Nation), LaDainian Tomlinson (NFL standout) and Tara Watson (Miss Texas 2000).
- ♦ The following companies are based in Fort Worth: Alcon Laboratories, AmeriCredit, American Airlines, Bell Helicopter-Textron, Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway, Cash America, Lockheed Martin, Pier 1 Imports, Radio Shack and Travelocity.com.
- ♦ According to a recent article in *Men's Health*, Fort Worth ranks second in the nation behind only Honolulu in prettiest females per capita in the United States.
- ♦ *Men's Fitness* ranked TCU eighth in its list of the fittest college campuses.
- ♦ TCU's campus is five miles from downtown Fort Worth.
- ♦ TCU's mission statement is "To educate individuals to think and act as responsible citizens in the global community."
- ♦ Fort Worth is the 19th-largest city in the United States. Fort Worth was also named in the top 10 of America's Most Liveable Communities.
- ♦ The Fort Worth/Dallas television market is ranked fifth in the United States.

- ♦ TCU led the way with seven selections, and three individual award winners, on the preseason All-Mountain West Conference team.
- ♦ The Frogs were represented by defensive end **Jerry Hughes**, punter **Anson Kelton**, return specialist **Jeremy Kerley**, offensive tackle **Marshall Newhouse**, cornerback **Rafael Priest**, cornerback **Nick Sanders** and linebacker **Daryl Washington**.
- ♦ TCU captured three of the four preseason individual honors as Hughes was tabbed the Defensive Player of the Year, Kerley received Special Teams Player of the Year and tailback **Ed Wesley** was selected as the Freshman of the Year.

- ♦ Last year, TCU was one of only three schools to have a football team finish in the top 10 and a baseball team advance to the Super Regionals. The others were Florida and Texas.

THE GRADUATES

- ♦ The Frogs have three players (cornerback Rafael Priest, offensive tackle Nic Richmond and tailback Chris Smith) who have already earned their TCU degree and are playing as graduate students this fall.
- ♦ Eighteen TCU football players received their degree last year.

- ♦ The Frogs have more freshmen on their depth chart (17) than seniors on the roster (13).

SELECT COMPANY

- ♦ TCU is one of just 19 schools to have won multiple national championships (1935, 1938) and produce a Heisman Trophy winner (Davey O'Brien, 1938).
- ♦ The others members of this select group are Army, Auburn, Florida, Florida State, Georgia, LSU, Miami (Fla.), Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Penn State, Pittsburgh, SMU, Texas and USC.

- ♦ With 41 victories, last year's senior class set a TCU win record for a four-year period.
- ♦ This year's seniors have already accumulated 30 victories in the last three campaigns.

TURNAROUNDS

- ♦ Just one year after being the first team in the nation to play 11 games, TCU is now the next-to-last school in the country to start its season.
- ♦ The Frogs played the opening 11 weeks in 2008 with game No. 11, at Utah, being on a Thursday.
- ♦ TCU and Florida International were the only schools not to play last week. While TCU starts at 3:30 p.m. Eastern at Virginia, FIU has a 7 p.m. Eastern kickoff at Alabama.

RANKINGS

- ♦ At No. 17 this season, TCU had its highest ranking in a pre-season poll since 1960.
- ♦ The Frogs concluded last season seventh in both the Associated Press and *USA Today* Top 25, marking its highest appearance in a season-ending poll since 1959.
- ♦ Since the BCS was established for the 1998 season, TCU had the highest finish in the polls by a two-loss team from a non-automatic qualifying conference.

- ♦ TCU is looking to become just the fourth team in the 11-year history of the Mountain West Conference to capture the title after being the preseason pick to win the league.
- ♦ The Frogs' last two conference championships came after they were picked no higher than fourth. TCU has been picked to win the MWC in three of the last four seasons.

FROG OFFENSIVE NOTES

SETTING THE PACE

- ♦ In 2008, TCU set single-season school records for points scored (437) and touchdowns (56).
- ♦ TCU led the nation in time of possession (35:10). The Horned Frogs were 12th nationally in team rushing (220.2 yards per game) despite not having a player among the top 96 individually.
- ♦ The Frogs were second in the Mountain West Conference and 24th nationally in total offense (421.3 yards per game).
- ♦ TCU was third in the MWC and 21st nationally in scoring (33.6 points per game).
- ♦ The 220.2 yards per game rushing was the highest total at TCU since 2000 (275.6), LaDainian Tomlinson's senior season.
- ♦ TCU's average of 421.3 yards per game was its best mark since 2004 (430.7).
- ♦ The Frogs totaled at least 410 yards of offense in nine of 13 games.
- ♦ TCU scored in 41 of 52 quarters (78.8 percent). Only 13 teams nationally scored in a higher percentage of quarters than the Frogs.

- ♦ Dalton's 11 touchdown passes in the last six games surpassed his 2007 season total of 10 scoring tosses.
- ♦ Dalton has also excelled of late with his running ability:

CHASING HISTORY

- ♦ With victories in the 2007 Texas Bowl and 2008 Poinsettia Bowl, Andy Dalton is halfway to becoming only the second quarterback in college football history to win four bowl games as a starting quarterback.
- ♦ In 2008, West Virginia's Pat White became the first signal caller to accomplish the feat.

MVP, MVP

- ♦ Andy Dalton has received Most Valuable Player honors in TCU bowl games (2007 Texas, 2008 Poinsettia) each of the last two seasons.

ON THE GROUND AND IN THE AIR

- ♦ The Frogs have won 23 games in a row when rushing for more yards than passing.
- ♦ TCU has won 30 straight when rushing for at least 167 yards.
- ♦ Under head coach Gary Patterson, TCU is 36-2 with 200 or more yards rushing.
- ♦ TCU has won its last 24 contests when attempting 34 or fewer passes.
- ♦ The Frogs have won 23 of their last 24 games when throwing for 205 yards or less.
- ♦ TCU has won 17 of its last 19 games when completing 18 or less pass attempts.

PROTECTING THE BALL

- ♦ TCU committed nine turnovers in its 11 wins last season (0.8 per game).
- ♦ The Frogs had six turnovers (3.0 per game) in two losses.

THE FAVORITE TARGET

- ♦ Wide receiver Jimmy Young's team-best 59 receptions in 2008 nearly doubled the next-closest Frog (Ryan Christian, 30).
- ♦ Young fell 12 yards short of just the second 1,000-yard receiving season in TCU history. His 988 yards placed second on the Frogs' single-season chart behind only Reggie Harrell's 1,012 in 2003.

- ♦ Young was fifth in the MWC and 41st nationally in receiving yards per game (76.0) and seventh in receptions (4.5 each contest).
- ♦ All five of Young's touchdown receptions for the season came in the last six games.
- ♦ Young set a TCU single-game record with 226 yards receiving to go with three touchdowns on five catches against Wyoming.
- ♦ The 226 yards represented the high game by an MWC player last season and the sixth-best effort in the nation in 2008.
- ♦ Young broke the TCU single-game mark of 206 set in 1994 by Jimmy Oliver against Texas Tech. It was just the fourth 200-yard receiving day in TCU history.
- ♦ The 226 yards broke his previous personal-best of 111 set earlier in the season at Oklahoma.
- ♦ Young was the first Frog with four 100-yard receiving games in a season since Cory Rodgers in 2004.

THIRD DOWN AND RED-ZONE SUCCESS

- ♦ TCU was eighth nationally with its 51.4 percentage (111-of-216) on third-down conversions.
- ♦ The Frogs scored on 58-of-65 red-zone possessions, including 46 touchdowns, to tie for 17th nationally with an 89.2 percent success rate.

GROUND GAME BY COMMITTEE

- ♦ TCU's 220.2 yards per game rushing ranked 12th nationally, despite no Frog placing in the top 96 individually.
- ♦ Five players averaged between 29.7 and 54.7 yards per game.
- ♦ Ten of the top-12 rushers had at least a 4.0 per carry mark.
- ♦ TCU's 220.2 yards per game rushing was the highest mark in the eight-year tenure of head coach Gary Patterson and the most since 2000, when LaDainian Tomlinson keyed a Frog ground attack that averaged 275.6 yards per game.

SIGNAL CALLER DEPTH

- ♦ Through the opening seven games, TCU was the nation's only school to have one quarterback (Andy Dalton) leading the team in passing and another (Marcus Jackson) in rushing.
- ♦ With Dalton sidelined for two games, Jackson started and led TCU to victories over San Diego State and Colorado State.
- ♦ In making just his second collegiate start (Oct. 4), Jackson was the MWC Offensive Player of the Week after totaling 246 yards and three touchdowns in a 41-7 win over the Aztecs.
- ♦ Jackson was fifth on TCU with 384 yards rushing. He had two of the Frogs' four 100-yard rushing games (115 yards at SMU; 131 yards against San Diego State).
- ♦ His 79-yard touchdown carry at SMU was TCU's longest run from scrimmage since 2001 and the longest scoring play since 2006, when Jackson had an 84-yard TD pass at Baylor.

HOOPS ANYONE?

- ♦ Starting center Jake Kirkpatrick (6-foot-3, 305 pounds) can dunk a basketball. He did not play football until his senior year of high school.
- ♦ Kirkpatrick is also the lone married player for the Frogs.

BULLPEN HELP

- ♦ If the TCU baseball team (which fell a game short of the College World Series last year) needs pitching help, the Frog football team might be able to help.
- ♦ Wide receiver Jeremy Kerley hit 94 on the radar gun with his fastball at Hutto High School, while quarterback Yogi Gallegos topped out at 90 during his days on the mound at Irving High School.

MULTI-SPORT STAR

- ♦ Offensive tackle Marcus Cannon is the only TCU football player to be All-Mountain West Conference in more than one sport.
- ♦ An honorable-mention all-league pick on the gridiron last season, Cannon was also All-MWC in the shot put for the TCU track and field team.

FUTURE SID

- ♦ Wide receiver Curtis Clay interned this summer in the TCU athletics media relations office.
- ♦ As part of his myriad of duties, Clay worked on media guides for several sports, including football, in addition to writing news releases for GoFrogs.com.

THE VERSATILE ONES

- ♦ Tailback Ryan Christian was TCU's top receiver out of the backfield with 30 receptions, placing second on the team.
- ♦ Wide receiver Jeremy Kerley rushed for a career-high 77 yards on nine carries, including a 16-yard score, in the 32-7 win over BYU.
- ♦ Kerley had three rushing touchdowns while adding 11 receptions. He ranked 13th nationally in punt returns (13.9 yards).
- ♦ Kerley is 2-of-3 passing for 54 yards in his career.

DON'T FORGET THE O

- ♦ Four of the five highest-scoring teams in TCU history have come in the last eight seasons.
- ♦ Additionally, four of the top five single-season touchdown totals by TCU have come in the last five years.
- ♦ Two of TCU's top-three games in total offense have come in the past three seasons.

DRIVE CHART

- ♦ The Frogs scored on their opening series in 10 of 13 games last season, totaling seven touchdowns and three field goals.
- ♦ In two of the three games it did not score on its first possession, TCU produced points on its second series.

FROG DEFENSIVE NOTES

STINGY D

- ♦ In 2008, TCU led the nation in total defense for the third time in nine seasons. No other team in the country has finished first in defense as many times as TCU in that stretch. The Frogs surrendered just 217.8 yards per game. USC was second at 221.8. No other teams were below 263.5 yards.
- ♦ TCU topped the nation in run defense at 47.1 yards per game. Alabama was second at 74.1.
- ♦ The Frogs (1.7) were the only team in the country allowing less than 2.0 yards per carry. Alabama was second at 2.7.
- ♦ TCU (11.3 points per game) was second in scoring defense behind only USC (9.0). Only six of the Frogs' 13 opponents in 2008 scored in double figures.
- ♦ TCU led the nation in allowing only 12.1 first downs per game. Virginia Tech was second (13.7).
- ♦ The Frogs topped the MWC and were fourth nationally in pass efficiency defense (97.9). Opposing QBs completed 50.3 percent of their passes with 15 interceptions and eight touchdowns.
- ♦ TCU was fifth nationally in opponent third-down conversions, allowing a 28.7 percent success rate.
- ♦ Only six teams surpassed 28 yards rushing with six opponents cracking 200 yards in total offense:

SACK MASTERS

- ♦ TCU's 43 sacks ranked second in the nation behind only Texas (47).
- ♦ TCU recorded four sacks at Oklahoma. Sooner quarterbacks were sacked nine times in their other 12 games.
- ♦ The Frogs totaled six sacks versus BYU after the Cougars had surrendered two sacks in their opening six contests. BYU allowed 14 sacks in its 12 games outside of TCU.

POINTS OFF THE BOARD

- ♦ TCU allowed more than one offensive touchdown in just one of its 11 victories.
- ♦ UNLV recovered a muffed punt at the Frog 12 to set up one score. The Rebels also reached the end zone on a late fourth-quarter drive after TCU cleared its bench leading 44-7.
- ♦ The Frogs surrendered seven points or less in seven of their 11 wins. In a 31-14 victory over Stanford, one of the Cardinal's two TDs came off a blocked punt return for a score.

CONSISTENT FACES

- ♦ Rafael Priest and Nick Sanders are the lone pair of cornerbacks in the nation to have started every game (39) the last three seasons.
- ♦ Only LSU offensive tackle Ciron Black (41) has a longer active streak of consecutive starts than Priest and Sanders.

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE

- ♦ Ten of TCU's 11 defensive starters last season were All-Mountain West Conference with three players (linebacker Robert Henson, safety Stephen Hodge, linebacker Jason Phillips) being drafted.
- ♦ Henson, defensive end Jerry Hughes, Hodge and Phillips were first-team selections.
- ♦ Safety Steven Coleman, nose tackle Cody Moore, defensive end Matt Panfil and cornerback Rafael Priest were second-team picks.
- ♦ Cornerback Nick Sanders and defensive tackle James Vess were honorable-mention choices.

CHASING HISTORY

♦ Jerry Hughes set a Mountain West Conference record last season with his nation-leading 15 sacks. He was two shy of TCU's single-season mark of 17 set by Bo Schobel in 2003.

MAGIC NUMBERS

- ♦ TCU is 30-2 in its last 32 games when allowing less than 333 yards of offense. The only two losses in that stretch have been the last two seasons to Utah.
- ♦ The Utes had 275 yards in their 13-10 win last season, and just 227 in a 27-20 victory in 2007.
- ♦ With head coach Gary Patterson, the Frogs are 48-6 when their opponent is at or below 300 yards of total offense.
- ♦ TCU is 52-7 under Patterson when holding its opponent under 100 yards rushing.

STAYING FRESH

- ♦ TCU opponents averaged just 56.8 plays from scrimmage. The Frogs had 274 more snaps (21.1 per game).
- ♦ Only four teams ran more than 58 plays against TCU.
- ♦ San Diego State had an MWC record-low 41 snaps.

PICK PARTIES

- ♦ TCU's 15 interceptions last season were by 10 different players.
- ♦ Defensive end Jerry Hughes and cornerback Nick Sanders are the returning interception leaders with two each.
- ♦ Sanders had two interceptions against BYU. It was the second two-interception game of his career. He also had two picks at Army in 2006. Sanders was the first Frog with a two-interception game since Rafael Priest in 2007 versus Colorado State.
- ♦ TCU had two interception returns for touchdowns in 2008. Hughes went 24 yards versus SMU, while Steven Coleman returned a pick 33 yards for a score against Stephen F. Austin.

SHUTTING THEM DOWN

- ♦ Only four times in the last 29 games has TCU seen an opponent score a touchdown on its opening drive.
- ♦ TCU has surrendered 14 or less points in 20 of its last 23 wins.

CHECKING ON THE SOONERS

- ♦ TCU allowed Oklahoma just 214 yards over the final three quarters after the Sooners totaled 222 in the first quarter.
- ♦ Oklahoma's four touchdown passes totaled 218 yards, exactly half of its offense on the night. The Sooners' other 66 plays netted 218 yards (3.3 yards per snap).
- ♦ Oklahoma was sacked four times, had just 25 yards rushing on 36 attempts and was forced to punt a season-high nine times.

NO FRIEND OF RUNNING BACKS

- ♦ During his 100-game tenure as head coach, Gary Patterson has seen just 18 100-yard rushing games by opposing players.
- ♦ TCU has shown the ability to slow down top backs from the opposition:

STARTS

♦ While cornerbacks Rafael Priest and Nick Sanders have started all 39 games the last three seasons, TCU's other defensive players have combined for only 42 career starts: Jerry Hughes 14, Kelly Griffin 13, TeJay Johnson 12, Daryl Washington 2, Tekerrein Cuba 1.

FROGS SHINE IN RED ZONE

- ♦ Frog foes reached the red zone just 21 times in 2008, the lowest total in the nation.
- ♦ TCU tied for fourth in the nation in red-zone defense, allowing opponents to score on only 71.4 percent (15-of-21) of their visits.
- ♦ The Frogs surrendered nine touchdowns and six field goals in the red zone.
- ♦ In its last 32 games, TCU has allowed 29 TDs on 75 trips to the red zone.
- ♦ In 13 games, TCU opponents ran only 60 plays (4.6 per game) in the red zone.

YOUTHFUL FROGS

♦ Three true freshmen (linebackers Tanner Brock and Kenny Cain, and defensive tackle D.J. Yendrey) are in second-team positions on the depth chart.

POSITION SWAPS

- ♦ After starting 12 games at weak safety last season, TeJay Johnson is now at free safety.
- ♦ During spring practice, Alex Ibiloye was switched from cornerback to safety and is now No. 1 on the depth chart at weak safety.
- ♦ Tyler Luttrell moved from wide receiver to strong safety during preseason camp and is in a No. 2 position behind Colin Jones.
- ♦ Luttrell's father, Mike Luttrell, is TCU's 11th-leading career rusher with 2,312 yards (1972-74).

WORLD CHAMPION

- ♦ At the age of 10, linebacker Tank Carder captured a world championship in BMX racing. The title came in a competition outside Paris, France.
- ♦ After staking claim as the nation's best, Carder decided to retire while on top.
- ♦ Born Ricky Carder, the sophomore from Sweeny, Texas, acquired the nickname "Tank" as a toddler when, because of his size, people mistook him for being a lot older than he actually was.
- ♦ Carder's first career start came in the only contest the last four years not started by former standout linebacker Jason Phillips. Nursing a minor injury, Phillips was on the sideline as Carder got the nod in last season's 67-7 win over Stephen F. Austin.

LINEBACKER U

♦ TCU has sent three linebackers to the NFL in the last two seasons: David Hawthorne (Seattle), Robert Henson (Washington) and Jason Phillips (Baltimore).

HE'S BACK

- ♦ In 2007, defensive tackle Kelly Griffin became the only true freshman to start in Gary Patterson's eight-year tenure as TCU's head coach.
- ♦ After playing behind James Vess last season, Griffin has returned to the starting lineup this fall at nose tackle.

FROG SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

A FOUR-PEAT

- ♦ With punt returner Jeremy Kerley a first-team selection, TCU has had the first-team All-Mountain West Conference return specialist in each of its first four seasons in the league (Cory Rodgers, 2005; Brian Bonner, 2006-07).
- ♦ Kerley's 13.9 yard average ranked 13th in the nation.
- ♦ Aaron Brown was an honorable-mention All-MWC pick as a kick returner. His 29.2 average was fifth in the nation.

BIG RETURNS

- ♦ TCU was fourth in the nation in kickoff returns with its average of 25.7 yards.
- ♦ Aaron Brown's 85-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Wyoming marked TCU's first kick return for a score since Cory Rodgers went 100 yards at BYU on Sept. 24, 2005.
- ♦ Earlier last season, Brown had kickoff returns of 75 yards at Oklahoma and 56 versus BYU.

THE WEAPON

- ♦ In 11 of 13 games, TCU punter Anson Kelton placed at least half his kicks inside the opponent 20-yard line.
- ♦ For the season, 30 of Kelton's 54 punts (55.6 percent) went inside the 20 with just seven touchbacks.
- ♦ Kelton still managed a 41.3 yard average on the season.
- ♦ In being named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week, Kelton put four of seven punts against Colorado State inside the Ram 13. Two kicks landed inside the 3.
- ♦ Five of six Kelton boots at Oklahoma, and four of seven versus Stanford, went inside the 20.
- ♦ Kelton had a career-long 58-yard punt in the rain and wind of the Stanford game.

A RUN AT LOU GROZA

- ♦ Ross Evans was one of 20 semifinalists for the 2008 Lou Groza Award and the lone freshman candidate.
- ♦ Evans was 16-of-20 on field goals. He had a streak of 12 consecutive made kicks at one point in the season.
- ♦ Evans' 80.0 percentage tied for 14th nationally among kickers with at least 20 attempts.
- ♦ Four of his made kicks were from at least 39 yards.
- ♦ On his first collegiate field-goal attempt, Evans hit from 50 yards. It was the sixth-longest made kick by a freshman nationally last season. It also tied for the 12th-longest field goal in TCU history.
- ♦ Evans' 49 PATs were one shy of equaling TCU's single-season record.
- ♦ Evans tied TCU's single-game PAT record, accomplished four other times, with eight against Stephen F. Austin. Evans missed an opportunity to have sole possession of the mark when a bobbled snap after the eighth of TCU's nine touchdowns was run in for two points by holder Jeremy Kerley.

THE COVERAGE GAME

- ♦ TCU ranked 25th nationally with its opponents averaging only 19.1 yards on 70 kickoff returns.
- ♦ When throwing out 50 yards credited as part of a blocked punt by Stanford, the Frogs allowed just 143 yards (5.7 average) on 25 opponent punt returns.

IN SEARCH OF THE END ZONE

- ♦ TCU has not returned a punt for a touchdown in its last 86 games, the eighth-longest current stretch in the nation.
- ♦ The Frogs' last punt return for a touchdown came in the 2002 season opener (Sept. 2) at Cincinnati when Terran Williams went 70 yards for a score.
- ♦ The streak nearly came to an end in last year's season opener in Albuquerque when Jeremy Kerley returned a fourth-quarter New Mexico punt 53 yards to the Lobo 4-yard line.

BLOCK PARTIES

- ♦ Antoine Hicks recorded TCU's lone punt block of the season in the Wyoming game. The ball then went out of the end zone for a safety.
- ♦ TCU has seven punt blocks in its last 30 games.
- ♦ The Frogs have totaled 17 blocked kicks, including 14 punt blocks, since 2002.
- ♦ Daryl Washington blocked three punts (Air Force, Wyoming and Utah) in 2007 to tie Ohio's Joshua Abrams for the national lead.

IDLE KICKERS

- ♦ While TCU's Ross Evans attempted 20 field goals and made 16, Frog opponents were just 7-of-9.

SECRET WEAPON FOOT

- ♦ Quarterback Andy Dalton is 3-for-5 in his TCU career on placing pooch kicks inside the opponent 20-yard line.
- ♦ After two successful punts in 2007, Dalton put a third-quarter kick at New Mexico out-of-bounds at the Lobo 4. Another Dalton punt went to the New Mexico 8 but was brought out to the 22 after a kick catching interference call.
- ♦ Dalton is averaging 34.4 yards on five career punts.

♦ Field - Defensive coordinator/defensive line coach Dick Bumpas, cornerbacks coach Clay Jennings, co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Jarrett Anderson, tight ends/special teams coordinator Dan Sharp, offensive line coach Eddie Williamson.

MAGIC NUMBER 17

♦ Under head coach Gary Patterson, TCU is 52-1 when allowing 17 points or less.
♦ The only loss was last year's 13-10 decision at Utah. It snapped the Frogs' 65-game overall winning streak when holding the opponent to 17 or fewer points. The streak began after a 17-7 loss at Northwestern on Sept. 11, 1999.

THE TURNOVER STORY

♦ TCU tied for 10th in the nation in turnover margin at +1.0 per game (+13 overall).
♦ Over the last four seasons, TCU is 35-1 when ahead (29-1) or even (6-0) in turnover margin and 6-9 when on the negative side.
♦ Since the start of the 2005 season, TCU is 41-10. In seven of the 10 defeats, the Frogs have been minus-2 or worse in turnover margin. TCU won at San Diego State in 2007 despite being minus-3 for the game.
♦ TCU has lost only once (at BYU, 2007) since Oct. 15, 2004 at UAB when holding the edge in turnover margin. The stretch covers 30 games.
♦ The Frogs have posted at least one takeaway in 47 of their last 54 contests.

BALL CONTROL

♦ TCU led the nation in time of possession at 35:10, over a full minute more than runner-up Nebraska (34:01) and third-place Virginia Tech (33:00).
♦ TCU has won 30 of its last 32 games when ahead in that category. The only two losses in that stretch came last season at Oklahoma and Utah.
♦ In last year's regular-season finale against Air Force and its run-oriented attack, the Frogs held a 38:32 to 21:28 edge in time of possession.
♦ TCU had the ball for 36:07 compared to 23:53 for Boise State in the Poinsettia Bowl.
♦ TCU had a 2008 season-best 43:29 in possession time against San Diego State.

PLAYING AHEAD

♦ In 10 of its 13 games last season, TCU opened with a lead of at least 10-0:

♦ TCU did not trail in nine of its 11 wins.
♦ The Frogs were behind Colorado State 7-0 after the Rams' opening drive of the game. TCU rallied for a 13-7 win.
♦ TCU was down 10-0 to Boise State in the opening 7:15 before a 17-16 victory.

CLOSE CALLS

♦ Dating back to the 2003 campaign, TCU is 20-8 in its last 28 games decided by seven points or less.

BEATING THE RANKED

- ♦ TCU had two wins over top-10 teams in 2008. The Frogs defeated then-No. 8 BYU, 32-7, on Oct. 16 before a 17-16 victory over No. 9 Boise State in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- ♦ It was the first time since 1961, when victories were posted over No. 1 Texas (6-0) and No. 8 Kansas (17-16), that TCU defeated two top-10 teams in the same season.
- ♦ The win over BYU marked the highest-ranked opponent TCU beat since a 17-10 victory at No. 5 Oklahoma in 2005. That was also the Frogs' previous win over a top-10 team.
- ♦ TCU's 25-point win over BYU marked the largest margin of victory over a top-10 team in school history. The previous best was a 14-0 win over No. 6 Texas in 1946.
- ♦ The Frogs defeated a top-10 team at home for the first time since a 17-9 victory over No. 9 Texas A&M in 1965.

PLAYING STRAIGHT THROUGH

- ♦ With its Nov. 6 date at Utah, TCU became the first team nationally last season to play 11 games.
- ♦ The Frogs were one of just three teams not to have an open date through its opening 11 contests.
- ♦ With a 9-2 record last season and a 10-1 mark in 2005, TCU is a combined 19-3 the last two times it played 11 straight weeks to begin a campaign.

PRIVATE SCHOOLS

- ♦ TCU is one of 17 private schools in the 120-team Football Bowl Subdivision.
- ♦ The others are Baylor, Boston College, BYU, Duke, Miami (Fla.), Northwestern, Notre Dame, Rice, SMU, Stanford, Syracuse, Tulane, Tulsa, USC, Vanderbilt and Wake Forest.

- ♦ Since the start of the 2005 season, TCU is 39-4 when playing on any day of the week other than Thursday. The Frogs are 2-6 in Thursday games.
- ♦ Six of TCU's 10 losses over the last four years have been on Thursdays.
- ♦ The Frogs are 18-1 in day games over the last four seasons and 23-9 at night. The NCAA constitutes a night game as starting at 5 p.m.
- ♦ TCU is 35-4 in Saturday contests dating back to the start of the 2005 campaign. The Frogs saw a 19-game winning streak on Saturdays snapped at Texas in 2007. It was TCU's first loss on a Saturday in nearly two full years.
- ♦ During their run of success on Saturdays, the Frogs are 6-6 on other days of the week (1-0 on Sundays, 2-0 on Tuesdays, 2-6 on Thursdays, 1-0 on Fridays).

- ♦ After three winning seasons in 13 years (1985-97), TCU has won 72.6 percent (98-37) of its games since 1998 when head coach Gary Patterson arrived as defensive coordinator. It's the 10th-best mark nationally in that stretch.
- ♦ TCU is 557-511-57 (.520) in its football history which began in 1896.

QUICK STARTS

- ♦ The Frogs have scored in the first quarter in 38 of their last 48 games.

TCU HEAD COACH GARY PATTERSON



Gary Patterson has produced five 10-win seasons in the last seven years, including four 11-win campaigns since 2003. No other coach in TCU history has more than two 10-win seasons.

Patterson's 73-27 (.730) record is the best mark of the four coaches in TCU history to be on the sideline for at least 100 games. Dutch Meyer, coach of the 1935 and 1938 national championship teams, is second (.665, 64-31-5, 1934-40). Patterson's 73 wins are third on the Frogs' career victory list and one shy of tying Abe Martin (74, 1953-66) for second.

Patterson's .730 winning percentage is second among TCU coaches with more than 20 games under their belt and 11th among active coaches in the Football Bowl Subdivision.

Since arriving at TCU as defensive coordinator in 1998, Patterson has helped guide the Frogs to four conference titles and 10 bowl games in 11 seasons. TCU is one of just seven programs to have a current bowl winning streak of at least four games.
